## Major League Baseball trains Camp Darby youth

When Steve Parkhurst, the School Liaison Officer, learned that Major League Hall of Famer Rod Carew, Lee Smith, Bruce Hurst, Jim Lefebvre, Barry Larkin, Bob Didier, John Cangelosi and German Geigel were at the 3rd annual Major League Baseball International clinic in Tirrenia, Italy, he quickly arranged a once in a life time opportunity for Camp Darby's youth.

He gathered members of the YS baseball team and drove them down to the Olympic training area, the site of the Major League Baseball European Baseball Academy. When Jim Lefebvre, blew his whistle and 50 of Europe and Africa's baseball league hopefuls ended their eight-hour training day with more laps around the field, the seven Camp Darby's youth step forward warily. They were excited and nervous about this chance to be coached by Major Leaguers.

"I never thought I would ever get the chance to actually meet baseball history in the flesh," said Amanda Oliver, 10th grader. "It's an amazing opportunity and I'll never forget it."

"My friends back in the states are going to be so jealous because I got to

play with MLB and meet people who broke records," said William Berrios, a senior. "Maybe their skills will rub off on me."

Lefebvre has been in the big leagues for over 24 years and played many years with the Los Angeles dodgers, coached the Reds and managed Chicago Cubs, Seattle Mariners and Milwaukee Brewers. He understands that the children of military members are a long way from home and don't get the same chances as kids in America to see a ballgame.

"Their parents are defending our

## Mystery wreath appears at Camp Darby Patriot Day tribute

In the early hours of September 11 as the sun was rising in the east over the Tuscan hills, USAG Livorno soldiers placed a flower wreath resembling the American flag at the installations flagpole. As the sun began to set in the west over the Liguria sea, a group of Italians and Americans paid tribute by adding their wreath. Somewhere in between, another wreath in memory of Jeanette LaFond-Menichino appeared.

The wreath was delicate, with crystal white lilies and gold embossed ribbon. It was a mystery that made one stop and think about the name, about who the woman was and who had remembered her here in Italy so far away from New York. This wreath wasn't just in memory of all the victims. This one had a single name and somewhere a story.

An internet search revealed that LaFond-Menichino had been a senior account analyst at Marsh & McLennan. She was 49-years-old when she died during the attacks on the World Trade Center. She has a sister, Anita LaFond Korsonsky. But the research didn't answer how the flowers with her name ended up at Camp Darby, Italy.

After three days of asking various community members if the name "Jeanette LaFond" meant anything to them, there was a break in the mystery case.

"On Sunday, Maria Rosa (Contadini-Piurucci) brought in the flower display and placed it in the chapel," said Elizabeth Speck, an employee at ACS. "After the service, it was stored in a refrigerator until it could be placed at the flagpole on Patriot Day."

Locating Maria Rosa Contadini- Piurucci, an employee at the child development center, she told her story of Jeanette.

*"Jeanette was my cousin. My mother was American and my father was Italian, so Jeanette had family in America and Italy. Her mother, my 80-year old aunt, was visiting from Brooklyn, New York 9/11 weekend. When we placed the wreath, for my aunt it was a gift, but for me it was going deeper inside the pain."*

*"Jeanette was older than me, but we hung out together and would celebrate New Years together. When she got this job on the 94<sup>th</sup> floor of the World*



*Trade Center, it was such a big deal and all of our Italians relatives wanted to go visit her. When 9/11 happened, I was going to the American consulate in Florence to renew my passport and heard it on the radio. It was such a tragedy.*

*My family, we receive hundreds of telephone calls and letters which was comforting. But, the search team never found anything concrete of Jeanette that we could bury and mourn in a cemetery, so there has always been that emptiness. I really can't describe how one feels or copes. It's hard when you lose somebody. Under normal circumstances, you have to digest the pain and let it go through your system. Jeanette just disappeared from our life.*

*My aunt is a volunteer and gives tours at the World Trade Center. She wears a necklace around her neck with a picture of Jeanette. She gets to talk about Jeanette with the visitors and it is good for her. I live here in Italy and I'm so far away so I was glad we laid the wreath in tribute to Jeanette.*

*I don't think people need to find a reason to remember 9/11, it was just such a tragedy. I think it's important to keep the individual names alive. I wish people could learn to respect each other regardless of religion and country."*

country which we love and these kids deserve a lot," he said. "We are very fortunate to be in a position to do this training day and we want to do more things like this more often. We're available for these kids overseas if they ever need us."

Playing a wide variety of sports overseas or watching live sporting events can be particularly challenging for the youth.

"When I moved here, a lot of people told me I should try out for baseball," said Oliver "because then there would be enough kids to have a team. Now, most of the time I'm the only girl playing at our baseball games. But, I feel good knowing that I can play with boys and still hold on my own."

Her teammate Berrios says he wants to pass on what he learned to other kids who didn't get to make the training session.

"Having MLB show you skills to improve on and practice with you is awesome because I can use those drills to help teach youth when I get to coach," said Berrios.

At the end of the training session, Lefebvre

told the youth if they want to be good at anything, they've got to work hard.

"You've got to put the time in to it, the effort, the training, the dedication and focus," he said. "Once you learn the game fundamentally, you've got to go out and play."

He added that the greatest lesson he hopes the youth leave with is to understand that everyone needs one another.

"No one man carries a team. Everybody does it together and that is what is true in life," he said.

## Italian legal and strike updates

**Driving in Livorno**– The Mayor office in Livorno has passed a decree that goes into effect October 1 placing new limitations to vehicular traffic and offering new incentives for less polluting vehicles.

Circulation prohibition corresponds to the city's area "Bollino blue", comprised within the perimeter of viale I.Nievo, viale V.Alfieri, viale Petrarca, viale Boccaccio, viale N.Sauro, viale Italy, piazza del G.Mazzini, scali N.Lena, scali E.Cialdini, piazza del Pamiglione, via della Cinta Esterna and via M. Mastacchi.

Traffic timetables have also increased. Previously, certain areas were off limits from 9am to 1pm and 2pm-6pm. Now, those without "Bollino blue" or with vehicles that are considered high polluting, are off limits from 8am-8pm.

You're exempt from "Bollino blue" if you have: an electrical or hybrids with thermal electric motor

or hydrogen or have a vehicle that uses bifuel (benzine - methane, benzine-gpl). US military and civilians should check with the PMO about acquiring a "Bollino blue" if they live in Livorno.

**Smoking banned at rail stations**– An law banning smoking in train stations went into effect on Friday, September 28. Anyone who is caught lighting up in the lobby, ticket halls or restrooms will receive a hefty fine.

The only area that smokers can still inhale is next to the ash trays alongside the tracks. A new line of special bins will be placed outside each station specifically for cigarette disposal.

Since April 2006 the Army has offered adult victims of domestic violence the option of unrestricted reporting or restricted reporting. Please know that restricted reporting of domestic abuse can be made to: Victim Advocates, the Victim Advocate Supervisor, Chaplains, Healthcare providers and FAP Clinical Social Workers.

**Issue Description:** The lockers are underutilized, and many of us have to carry our shampoo, shower shoes, and other items each time. I have yet to see more than one or two lockers being used at any time. The reason is simple - if you have to carry your stuff with you anyways, why bother to put it in a locker for the duration of your workout when you can just put it back in your car (which you would have to do regardless)?

**Recommendations:** Set aside 25% of the lockers for assigned use. Require the users to get their key each time and if the locker is not being used, then they lose it.

**Response:** Vincent Firriolo, Fitness Specialist: We are not assigning lockers to any of our fitness users due to security reason. We check every night all the lockers to make sure no one leaves anything that could be considered a threat or harmful to anyone. If we find a locker with a lock, we must remove it and check what's inside. Whatever is not considered a threat or harmful, we store in the Lost and Found. It's a policy that was brought in after 9/11.
